LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear Friends,

What a year we've had! The dedicated HOME, Inc. team has truly embodied our updated mission statement, and we're proud to showcase their incredible impact. Here's a snapshot ...

In 2023-2024, HOME, Inc.'s HUD-certified housing counselors and property team:

- Fielded nearly 5,000 calls, emails and in-person requests for help from tenants, tenant advocates and landlords
- Presented more than 100 people with homebuyer education
- Taught 195 participants about tenant rights and responsibilities through RentWise
- Provided more than 1,500 tenants and hopeful homebuyers with one-on-one counseling
- Oversaw over \$1.2 million investment in new affordable housing development and 16 home rehabilitation projects

With all we've accomplished, our community's needs are growing, so HOME, Inc. is doubling down to do even more.

We're creating new counseling and education to equip homeowners with the tools they need for long-term success. This program will cover essential topics like seasonal and preventative maintenance, financing

major repairs and energy efficiency improvements, property insurance and taxes. We'll also explore estate planning — a vital step in building generational wealth.

Our team is pursuing projects to expand neighborhood revitalization and affordable housing development through partnerships with mission-driven nonprofit and for-profit organizations. And we continue building relationships with groups that help us reach more underserved populations.

HOME, Inc.'s new, more robust volunteer engagement program is thriving as we find unique and meaningful ways to connect and further our mission.

None of this work would be possible without the generous support of our funders, community partners, local government allies and volunteers, including the HOME, Inc. Board of Directors. We thank you for your continued commitment to helping us ensure all our neighbors can obtain and maintain a safe, stable and affordable place to call home.

OUR MISSION

We empower our neighbors by helping them overcome the barriers to obtaining and maintaining safe, stable, affordable housing. We do this through education, housing counseling, neighborhood revitalization and affordable housing development.



HURDLES TO SAFE, AFFORDABLE HOUSING

Accessing safe, affordable housing in central Iowa has never been more challenging, particularly in Polk County. Demand outpaces supply, and rental and mortgage rates are at historic highs while wages remain flat. For lower-income households, barriers to housing are even greater.

Counseling Services

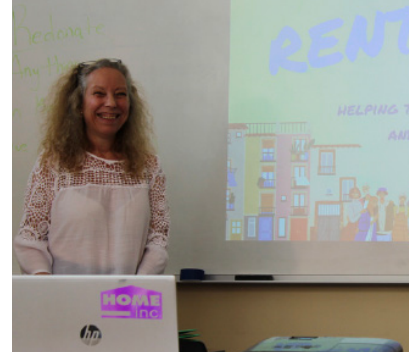

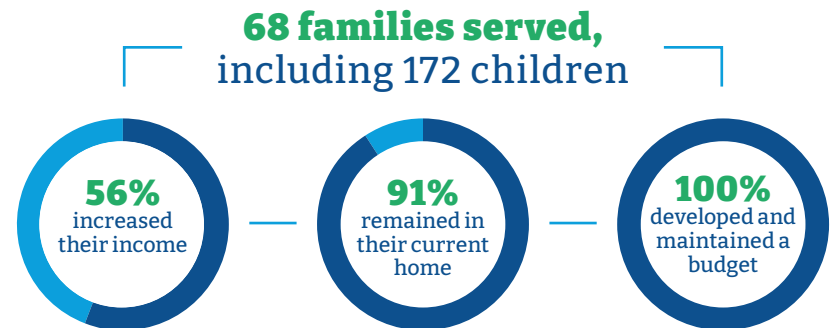
RentWise

One-third of central Iowans face challenges meeting basic living expenses, particularly housing.* The HOPE for Stable Families initiative is a lifeline for those at risk for homelessness or recovering from crisis, offering a pathway out of poverty and towards long-term financial stability. Serving families with children, HOME, Inc. provides short-term rental assistance, case management, connections to partner agencies and more.

RIISING FROM THE ASHES

Patricia's life was turned upside down by a devastating house fire. Soon after, the contractor she trusted to help rebuild took her money, gutted her home and disappeared.

For four long years, Patricia, her daughter and her five grandchildren endured a series of displacements, moving from an apartment to living with family and eventually finding refuge in a shelter. Then, in February 2024, Patricia found HOME, Inc. and a new sense of hope.

Determined to help change her fate, HOME, Inc. partnered with multiple organizations to secure the funding needed to restore Patricia's home. With the family safely moved into temporary housing, renovations began.

Fast-forward to summer 2024. Against all odds, HOME, Inc. transformed the once fire-damaged three-bedroom house into a

spacious five-bedroom home where Patricia and her family can thrive.

Going above and beyond, HOME, Inc. also secured donations of furniture and household essentials, helping Patricia's family regain a sense of stability, comfort and peace.

Stable, healthy communities include quality, affordable housing with neighbors who take pride in where they live and care about one another. We empower clients to embrace homeownership and all it entails, creating generational wealth and contributing to the greater good.

Lease Purchase Program

Families in the Lease Purchase Program reside in houses owned by HOME, Inc., working steadily to build positive payment histories and improve credit scores. The goal is for families to eventually purchase their homes. HOME, Inc. proudly partners with banks and other community organizations to make this program possible.

A HOME OF THEIR OWN

For over a decade, Lindsay struggled to secure stable housing for herself and her four children. A Section 8 housing choice voucher helped pay rent, but finding a place to live that was affordable, safe and spacious enough for the family to grow remained an uphill battle. In 2020, Lindsay’s sister recommended HOME, Inc. for help — and hope for a brighter future.

Through counseling, education and connections to other community resources, HOME, Inc. helped Lindsay organize her finances and create a path to what once seemed impossible: owning her own home. In time, she moved into a HOME, Inc. property and participated in the Lease Purchase Program.

After years of hard work and HOME, Inc.’s unwavering support, Lindsay proudly became a first-time homeowner in April 2024.

With newfound confidence, Lindsay set her sights on opening an in-home daycare to serve families in her community. HOME, Inc. continues to rally around her, organizing volunteers to build a fence around her yard — a final step in making Lindsay’s dream a reality.

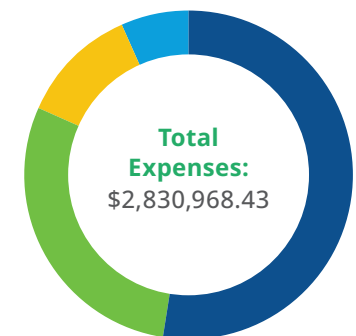
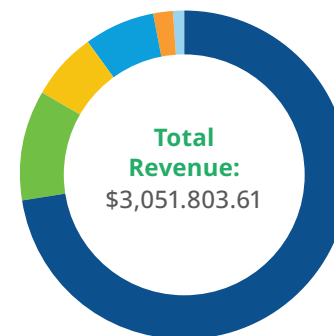
